Before school:

We offer a flexible drop off time for all Nursery and Infant pupils between 8:00am and 8:40am. During this time, Nursery children will have free play in their classrooms and Infant pupils will be supervised on the playground by members of the Infant staff. Please bring your child to The Mews gates where staff will be waiting to welcome them. Access to the school site may be made via the brown side door which leads from the Junior Playground.

The school day begins at 8:40 and so we ask for all pupils to be in school by this time.

Registration takes place at 8:45am for all Nursery and Infant Pupils and pupils will be marked as late after this time.

It is beneficial for your child to be in school on time to start the day in a settled way with their peers and not disrupt the subsequent teaching time. However, if you arrive between 8:40 and 9am please arrive at the Nursery and Infant playground and ring the buzzer to drop your child off. If you are later than 9am, please go to the main Reception and wait with your child until a member of staff arrives to take them to their form room.

End of the Day:

School finishes for Nursery and Infant pupils at 3:40pm. The gates to The Mews playground will be open from 3:30pm and you are welcome to wait in the playground until the classes are dismissed.

Pupils will only be released to a parent or known carer. If the pick-up arrangements for your child change, please ensure that their Form Tutor is made aware through an email, phone call or message. You may also phone School Admin to pass a message on. We are unable to let a pupil leave with an unknown adult if we have not had any notification.

At 4:00pm, pupils will be taken to After School Club and registered.

Pupils who are attending a co-curricular club will be taken to their activity and, unless informed otherwise, may be collected from the Mews gate. Any pupils not collected will be taken to After School Club.

After School Club:

After School Club is provided for all pupils in the Nursery and Infant Department and there are always two members of staff on duty. It is a paid for provision which runs from 4:00 pm until 6:00 pm and takes place in The Mews. Pupils are able to play games inside and out, enjoy creative activities and are provided with a light snack and drink.

Pupils may attend After School Club on a regular or intermittent basis. If you are delayed or unexpectedly need your child to attend, please email <u>admin@stjohnscollegecardiff.com</u> or your child's Form Tutor and a message will be passed on.

To collect your child from After School Club, make your way on the path past the main reception until you reach the secured gate entry system. Please ring the bell to allow staff to see and hear who you are coming to collect. The staff will then give you access through the main gate and bring your child out to the playground gate to meet you.

Occasionally, After School Club will be moved to a different location due to Parents' Evening or other activities. You will be informed in advance of this via the weekly update and on the notice board.

What to bring to school

- Summer school sunhat;

• Wellies - to be placed on the boot rack.

Please name all items of uniform clearly and remember that all snacks need to be **nut free**.

Pupils may bring a packed lunch to school or order a dinner from the dining room.

A weekly email is sent out for parents to order dinners for the following week and you will be billed via Parent Pay. We offer a flexible lunch format so you can make your choices on a weekly basis.

2. Academic Information

Curriculum

We believe that learning should be a rewarding and enjoyable experience. In both the Nursery and the Infants, we aim to lay firm foundations upon which all further knowledge may be based. We strive to help all the children in our care to develop their individual talents through the provision of a broad and balanced curriculum.

Our Nursery and Infant staff plan purposeful activities that are challenging but achievable, based on the areas of learning. They take into account the age and previous experiences of the children and their development level; recognising and planning for the needs of all our pupils to help them reach their full potential.

We aim to provide an environment in which all children will flourish; we are committed to providing equality of opportunity, regardless of race, gender, belief, disability and religion.

• Nursery

Nursery shadow the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum. We place a strong emphasis on the development of Numeracy and Literacy. Throughout the Nursery and Infants, stress is placed upon understanding each child and their family as unique, with different strengths, talents and needs.

The key areas of learning are:

- 1. Mathematics;
- 2. Language and Literacy;
- 3. Knowledge and Understanding of the World (Science, Geography and History);
- 4. Physical;
- 5. Creative;
- 6. PSE;
- 7. Welsh.

These areas of learning are taught through focused and free play activities with a strong emphasis on developing pupils' personal, social and emotional needs. We ensure that pupils have a wide variety of experiences which are meaningful to their own development and their growing understanding of the world around them. They especially enjoy their weekly cooking lesson and taking care of their own allotment patch where they grow vegetables, herbs and plants. An introduction to phonics is taught through the Monster phonics programme and JIGSAW for PSE is also followed; both of these schemes are followed through the Nursery and Infant School to allow for consistency and coherence.

• Infants

The curriculum is based upon the foundations of the National Curriculum for Wales for Foundation Phase and KS1 National Curriculum, and is enhanced through the provision of Drama, Italian, PE, Music and Welsh which are supported and taught by specialist teachers.

We use a number of well-known schemes to support our planning and learning such as Monster Phonics, Oxford Reading Tree, Abacus Maths Objectives, Collins English, and Jigsaw PSE, which are supplemented by activities designed to engage and provide for the abilities of all the children working within each class.

• Outdoor Learning

Exploring the world around them is a key part of the Nursery and Infant curriculum as the children learn about natural materials and textures, how plants grow and living things. Outdoor Learning enables staff to take meaningful and well planned learning experiences out of the classroom to enhance the lesson objective. This can include the school ground, and the local area and environment.

• Forest Fun

Forest fun is our planned and purposeful approach that uses activities and resources to enhance learning, social and emotional well-being, outdoor skills and environmental awareness. We aim to develop experiences in a broad range of outdoor activities; develop confidence to take risks, problem solve, build resilience and work cooperatively as part of a team; develop an understanding and appreciation for the natural environment; encourage pupils to lead healthy and active lifestyles.

• Sport

All pupils have two PE sessions each week and on those days they should wear their Sports kit including their house t-shirt. Pupils will be given opportunities to develop their physical skills, learn how to develop teamwork skills, and increase their individual fitness levels.

Whilst in R7, pupils will also have swimming lessons at one of the local Cardiff pools and led by experienced swimming coaches. We hold a traditional Sports Day event in the Trinity term.

Homework

You are important partners in helping your children to learn and we ask that you spend quiet and purposeful time with your child reading and completing their homework activities. We strongly encourage all parents to read and share stories with their child every day and enjoy a bedtime story together.

Homework helps to reinforce the skills and topic work covered in class. It also establishes a routine and this makes life easier as children get older and need to study. Time spent on Nursery and Infant activities should also be fun and an opportunity for you to talk to your children about their day. Be positive, encourage and praise whenever possible. If your child is finding it difficult to complete their homework, please do let us know.

Every child will be given a red homework bag which is also used for communications from your child's teacher. Please check the bag each night, especially if your child attends After School Club.

In Nursery, homework and a bedtime reading book will be sent home once a week and pupils will start to receive pupil reading books when they are ready for this next step.

In the Infants, in addition to reading and spelling, your child may be asked to complete a numeracy or literacy based activity and activities could also be RE, Science, History or Geography based. The amount of homework is tailored to the child's age and in R7 it may take around 30 minutes to complete. Please use a writing pencil and coloured pencils to complete written work; felt pens are not allowed.

Monitoring Progress

Every pupil's progress is carefully monitored to ensure that our teaching is appropriate to their needs and they are working to achieve their potential.

All assessments are age appropriate and arrangements are reviewed regularly and currently consist of:

Nursery:	On-entry Baseline and end of year follow up
R5:	On-entry Baseline and end of year follow up Standardised Literacy and Numeracy assessments throughout the year
R6:	Standardised Literacy and Numeracy assessments throughout the year
R7:	Standardised Literacy and Numeracy assessments throughout the year

Assessments are kept as low key as possible and, for our younger pupils, are often completed through observations.

Reporting to Parents

We operate an open door policy so parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher should they have any queries about their child's academic progress. Teachers are available at the start and end of the day though if you require a longer discussion please do arrange an appointment.

Parents' Evenings

Each term there is an opportunity to meet with your child's teacher. These meetings enable you to discuss academic and pastoral progress, raise any concerns you may have, see their classrooms, and to look at the work they have been completing.

Dates will be shared according to the annual calendar and further information for booking appointments will be sent approximately a fortnight before the evening. If you are unable to attend the given date, you are welcome to arrange a different time with your child's Form tutor.

Reports

Formal written reports will be sent home in February and at the end of the school year. These will highlight pupil progress as well as areas of development which you may be able to support further at home. Where there is a concern about the progress of a pupil, the Form Tutor will arrange to meet with the parent to discuss the way forward.

Learning Support

St John's College is committed to providing, for each pupil, the best possible environment for learning. We are guided by the Special Educational Needs and Disability Code of Practice, 2015 and The Disability Discrimination Act 2010 when carrying out our duties towards all pupils with special educational needs, and ensure that parents are notified when Learning Support provision is thought necessary for their child. All teachers are kept well informed of the Learning Support needs of individual pupils and this informs their lesson planning.

In the Nursery and Infant Department, we are able to offer Snappy and Nessy lessons with Mrs Howell, our specialist member of staff. We work in partnership with parents and Mrs McCaffrey (the school ALNCO) to discuss any additional learning needs and the support we offer. We also recognise when, unfortunately, we may not be able to meet a child's specific needs. Mrs McCaffrey is able to advise parents on how to support a child with ALN. Our staff will work together with Mrs McCaffrey and parents to follow any intervention strategies.

Educational Trips

Educational trips are a valuable part of any pupil's learning. They enable pupils to gain experiences outside the classroom which enhance their academic and personal development.

All educational visits are monitored by the Educational Visits Coordinator (EVC), and are risk assessed by the visit leader. The pupil teacher ratio will be determined by the age of the pupils

and the nature of the visit. Parents will be asked to complete a consent form prior to the visit and full details of the visit will be sent by the visit leader.

The cost of educational trips is not included in School fees. Payments for School trips will be added to your School Fee Account, on a termly basis.

3. Pastoral Care

St John's College is a Christian community within an inclusive Roman Catholic tradition and the values of kindness, caring, gentleness and working hard to do one's best are shared by the entire community of pupils, staff and parents. This collaborative approach is essential for success and frequent communication between teachers and parents is key to ensuring that each child develops and is nurtured in a place of happiness and security. Frequent informal opportunities arise for parents to talk to staff, to ensure that they are provided with adequate time and privacy should it be required.

If a child is upset or worried for whatever reason, Form staff are available at all times to support, guide and assist pupils. In the Nursery and Infant school, further support may be given by the Head of the Nursery or Head of the Infants. All concerns that need to be discussed further will be forwarded to Mrs Emma Jones (DSL).

Form Groups

St John's College has a system of naming Year groups according to the age that pupils will reach in that academic year. For example, pupils in R5 ('R' stands for 'rising') will have their 5th birthday during the course of that academic year. Accordingly, R7 is the equivalent of Year 2 in the maintained sector, while R6 is the equivalent of Year 1.

Charity and the Local Community

All pupils from Nursery to Sixth Form are involved in helping and supporting both the local and world community. Pupils at St John's College are always enthusiastic and keen to help those around them, and as part of the School family, they realise that in order to share the world, we must share our resources and if people are in need, we should join together to do whatever is necessary.

Across the year we support charities such as the local Food Bank, Children in Need, The Poppy Appeal, Mary's Meals and HCPT. Many of these are local charities as well as reflecting the Catholic ethos of the school.

As a School, we take pride in our understanding of the world community and hope to instil a sense of respect and compassion in all our pupils as they find their place in life.

In the Nursery and Infants, we also have regular visits to St Cadoc's Church, where we celebrate key festivals such as Christmas, Stations of the Cross and the Crowning of Mary.

Collective Worship

We have registration and a short act of worship every day for R5, R6 and R7. These worships include a reading for the day, prayers and a hymn. Once a week, we have a diversity celebration assembly and pupils are welcome to bring any badges, certificates or trophies

into school for activities they have completed outside of school. Each week we also have an assembly that reflects the given Values for that term.

During the course of the school year, each class prepares an assembly to which parents and family members are warmly invited. The assemblies are towards the end of the school day and are held on the school site.

School Rules

A list of common school rules is provided below:

- Pupils should be punctual for the school day and each lesson;
- Pupils must sign in at reception if they are late for registration;
- If a pupil is unwell, a parent/guardian is required to telephone the school at the beginning of the day;
- If a pupil is collected early for whatever reason, they must sign out with a parent/guardian;
- Pupils should be courteous and respectful at all times;
- Pupils are encouraged to open doors for visitors, staff and their peers;
- During lesson time, pupils should raise their hand to ask/answer a question;
- Work should always be presented neatly and homework handed in on time;
- All pupils must walk on the left in corridors and speak quietly;
- Pupils must adhere to the School uniform policy at all times;
- Pupils should not bring any valuables to school.

Rewards and Consequences

At St John's College, we reward good behaviour, a positive work ethic, achievements and values in a variety of ways.

It is known that positive encouragement promotes good behaviour and raises self-esteem. and this is acknowledged through:

- Verbal and written praise;
- Stickers;
- Star of the Week certificates;
- Form tutor reward systems;
- Termly 'Good Egg' afternoon tea with The Headteacher for pupils who exemplify a positive attitude and kindness towards others;
- House points.

Our main emphasis is on promoting positive behaviour through modelling and holding high expectations. Teachers will though deal with unacceptable behaviour in an appropriate manner according to the age of the pupil and behaviour demonstrated.

Individual staff will address minor behaviour problems through intervention strategies such as reminders, nonverbal signals, redirecting a pupil, encouragement of positive behaviour

and one-to-one discussions. This may result in an informal verbal warning, which should clearly indicate the consequences if there is repetition or no change in the behaviour.

If a serious incident occurs, a pupil may receive a *Time Out* which will be taken during the next playtime and gives the pupil time for further reflection and an opportunity to talk to an adult to resolve the issue, understand the consequences of their behaviour, and to move forward in so the behaviour will hopefully not be observed again.

Depending on the severity of the behaviour, Form Tutors will inform parents verbally or by email. More serious incidents would involve a phone call from the Form Tutor. Parents play a vital role in ensuring consistently good behaviour and we aim to build positive relationships and good communication in order to support and reinforce the school's policy on behaviour at home. A consistent message from home and school is vital for pupils to develop and understand our behavioural expectations.

Medication

- Parents are asked to sign a medical form at the start of each year which grants permission for the administration of Calpol, sun cream, Piriton, antiseptic wipes and plasters;
- Nursery and Infant staff will only administer prescription medicines that have been prescribed for the named child and are in date;
- Any medication given to a child is recorded in the class medical book and is witnessed by another staff member;
- Medication is kept out of reach of children;
- Any medication requiring refrigeration is kept in the Cottage fridge;
- All parents will be phoned before any Calpol is administered in school;
- Any pupils with specific medical needs will have a separate care plan outlining their individual requirements.

Transition

We endeavour to ensure a smooth transition for pupils on entry, between year groups and as they move to the Junior school. These are significant changes in a young person's life and they need to have opportunities to familiarise themselves with their new teachers and learning environment.

All pupils participate in a transition day during the second part of the Trinity Term. This enables them to spend a day with their new teachers in their new classrooms and begin getting to know their new room and teacher. New pupils are also invited to this day to enable them to feel more comfortable in starting school.

To prepare for moving to the Juniors, R7 pupils also enjoy a couple of extra sessions with their new teacher as we acknowledge that this is a big step for a lot of children. They also get to spend time in the Junior Playground exploring the new space.

Parents of R7 pupils are invited to a transition meeting where Mrs Taylor, Head of the Junior School, is able to share key information and answer any questions you may have about the move to the Juniors.

Teachers and support staff also need to know about their new children before they start in the class and so the passing on of the right information along with time to discuss their new classes is essential.

Anti-bullying

We are committed to providing a caring, safe and friendly environment for all our pupils so they can learn in a relaxed and secure atmosphere. Bullying of any kind is unacceptable at St John's College. If bullying does occur, all pupils should be able to tell and know that incidents will be dealt with promptly and effectively. We are a 'TELLING' school. This means that anyone who knows that bullying is happening is expected to tell the staff.

If your child is unable to eat items provided by other parents, please give the class teacher a supply of suitable treats so that they are not left out. We will place party invitations in homework bags but please ensure everyone is included.

Co-curricular Opportunities

St John's College aims to provide the richest and most diverse selection of co-curricular activities and clubs. Pupils are encouraged to participate in a range of activities aimed at enhancing their educational experience. The development of skills across the age range gives our pupils the best chance of shaping their future.

The list of co-curricular clubs is shared at the beginning of term and parents are able to sign up via SOCS.

Instrumental Teaching

We have a fantastic team of peripatetic staff who teach in School during the week. Their enthusiasm for their instrument motivates our young musicians to become confident solo performers. They also help and support our GCSE and A-Level pupils with their performance examinations.

Instrumental lessons available in school include:

- Piano
- Classical guitar
- Strings: Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Harp
- Woodwind: Flute, Clarinet, Oboe, Saxophone
- Brass: Cornet, Trumpet, French Horn, Trombone, Euphonium, Tuba
- Percussion: All orchestral percussion instruments including Drum Kit and Marimba
